with joyful hearts and minds we bless you for your mercy and join with saints and angels for ever praising you and saying:

All Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured + may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Jesus Christ is Lord:

All Lord, by your cross and resurrection you have set us free.
You are the Saviour of the world.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with [N and] all the saints to feast at your table in heaven. Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever. Amen

Breaking of the bread

Priest This bread which we break is the bread of life.

It is the sign of Christ's body

prepared by the Father

and offered in sacrifice by the Son

in a spirit of obedience to the Father's will.

All Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us.

Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us. Jesus, redeemer of the world, grant us peace.

Priest Blessed are we who "live on every word that

comes forth from the mouth of God."

All Blessed are we who are called to the banquet of the Lamb.

If you are a visitor and would usually receive Communion in your home church, you are welcome to receive Communion here.

If you do not wish to take Communion, please come for a Blessing, and carry this booklet when you come to the altar rail.

All Lord God, you have renewed us

with the living bread from heaven;

teach us always to hunger for him who is the true and living bread, and enable us to live by every word that proceeds from out of your mouth;
